## The Long Hot Summer

What we didn't count on was the weather. Starting in the last week in July, rainy weekends and a brutal Heat Wave kept us from skating. On Saturday, August 13th the National Weather Service issued a heat advisory and recommended against strenuous outdoor activities. Temperatures in Central Park were around 95 degrees and with the dense humidity the "feels like" temperature was around 106°.

We huddled with our staff and the DJ and decided on something we hate to do—we canceled. I went to the beach. Of course, there were some, the brave, the foolhardy, the diehard skaters; who come out rain, snow or blast furnace heat. They skated that day.

On Sunday the 14th the die hards shamed us into setting up the Circle. After all, it was only 92° and felt like a balmy 103°. We skated, but it was like moving slow motion in warm oatmeal.

We can only hope that we have survived the worst. September and October will almost certainly have better weather for skating—if we can dodge the Hurricanes. October is National Roller Skating Month and we are hoping for a great finish to our season.

We must acknowledge and thank the hardworking team of CPDSA volunteers who make the Skate Circle possible. # The View from Skaters Road

When we admit a new member into our Board of Directors, we ask one question: "What do you see yourself doing for the CPDSA?" This question is very important for our leadership, because there are so many things that must be done to keep the Skate Circle operating smoothly and so many talents we have beyond roller skating

It is not just board members who should be asking themselves this question. Those of us who skate or dance at the Circle know how much pleasure it brings us and, as in any relationship, we know that we must give something back if we are going to keep this good thing going.

There are so many things that must be done to keep the CPDSA operating, keeping accurate financial records, sales and fundraising, applying for official permits and dealing with the Parks Department, the Central Park Conservancy and the Central Park Police on a regular basis. There is also equipment maintenance and replacement, everyday and seasonal transport of our gear. Our communications apparatus includes a spectacular website, Facebook pages and groups, a weekly Skate News e-mail and this Newsletter to keep our skaters informed and amused. There are also the small things that make the Circle friendly and hospitable. If you are a regular, you should find a way that your talents or resources can help support the CPDSA.

For many years we have talked about making a 6 foot tall model of a roller skate for us to use in the Halloween Parade. This year, we have a number of people who want to see this skate happen. Maybe we can scale the size back

so that it would fit inside a van for transporting it, but we should resolve to make it happen this year.

We need people who are good artists or sculptors to design the look and get it in scale. We have fine metal mesh to mold it into shape, but we need people who can frame the supports, work with fiberglass cloth and epoxy resin for the outer skin. We will need a garage or some other large well ventilated place where we can work.

There's not a lot of time before Halloween, but this can be done if we get started right away and work together. We can start a message board, an e-mail thread or whatever new technology would work to keep everyone together. One or more of you might be good with that kind of communication to help us work together. Think about what you can do to make this dream come true.

We have lost a lot of days this year - to big events, rain, heat, you name it. We lose two whole weekends in September to big events, so lets take advantage of those extra days when we won't be skating in the park to make this vision a reality.

The mission of the Central Park Dance Skaters Association is first and foremost to keep the Skate Circle rolling and always improving. Beyond that, as an organization, we encourage roller skating, we support other skaters and try to help empower them. The CPDSA wants to be a resource for this kind of group endeavor that shows pride for the activity that brings us so much joy and to show our love for skating.
