### **Dedication** by Lezly Ziering

There is a small cadre of dedicated people working to overcome many obstacles that have been placed in their path - putting in their time and energy to solve problems way beyond the call of duty, only to have their heartfelt efforts ignored by some of the people they are working for.

The CPDSA closed its 2000 season at the end of October. From then until we opened our season in April, the small group who make up the board of directors was faced with many issues to resolve. Since our inception in '95, we have had storage space at Mineral Springs for our large steel equipment box, and we have had to rent storage space for our more sensitive sound equipment that needs more hands on attention during the off season.

Last October we were informed by the Parks Dept. that Mineral Springs would change management in 2001 and they had to clean out everything to offer it for lease; but we would probably be able to make a deal with the new owners to reestablish our space there. Meanwhile, we had to remove our storage box and

everything we have accumulated there for the past five years - a crushing blow. We stalled while we racked our brains and scrounged around trying to find someone or someplace that would accept this metal monstrosity and all the detritus that we have acquired. At the last moment my wife Robbin convinced her brother to store it for us at his home in Babylon L.I. So we rounded up a crew, and with the help of a Parks Dept. forklift, loaded the box into brother Tarig's truck, and carted our stuff out to Babylon. With great ingenuity and physical exertion, our loyal crew -Bob Nichols, Steve Heurung and Tyrone Cloud - unloaded the whole passel in my brother-inlaw's shed with the promise that it would all be removed by April.

We opened our season on April 15th still with no entree to Mineral Springs - the solution - we imposed on my brother-in-law to keep the box a bit longer while we negotiated for space with the new lessees of Mineral Springs. Meanwhile we rented additional storage space for the sound system - and with Tarig's truck and my car and the assistance of Bob. Joe and Steve Lindsey - carted the whole shebang back to the Apple. We then had to rent Tariq's truck for the weekends, which our indomitable crew loaded, drove to the outskirts of the Park, unloaded all the equipment onto carts and trucked it in several trips across one roadway, up and down hills, to the Skate Circle. At the end of the day reverse the whole procedure and that was just Saturday. The whole operation had to be repeated on Sunday - and again, for four weekends - draining our meager financial reserves to zero.

How about the members who meet throughout the year to deal with problems of funding, putting together a sound system that will meet the stringent requirements of the Parks Dept. for regulating the decibel level; who deal with scheduling and keeping the peace between the DJs, making certain they don't overextend the sound levels and jeopardize our existence (a constant running battle). Finally, to set up a system that has its own built in modifications


so that we don't have to sit at the DJs elbow for a 5 hour session monitoring sound levels. I for one detest that job - that's not what skating is about.

How did we get to this crossroads where the important thing is the bigger, better sound system? In 1994, the ultimate system made its appearance and brought the wrath of the Parks Dept. and NYPD. They warned us to reduce our decibel level. We did not and They Shut Us Down. We met with the powers that be and convinced them that we could manage ourselves according to their rules. In 1994 the music was controlled by DJs - they wanted big sound and ignored the agreement we had with the Parks Dept. and in 1995 They Shut Us Down Again, saying that what we had been doing for 20 years was over. They had charts displaying how our joyful activity was a center of debaucherv. attracting drug dealers, beer vendors and thieves; and cited the citizens who use the Park but don't like our kind of music or object to our volume. "Its a quality of life issue," they said. "What about our quality of life?," we asked. A few key skaters banded together to deal with all the opposition, and formed the CPDSA. We persevered and reestablished ourselves with the Parks Dept.

and NYPD and gradually were allowed to revive the Skate Circle in July of 1995.

Since then, we have organized a first class skating event that evolved from mixed tapes to a venue in which a variety of music providers bring out their turntables and records or CDs and spin live for the skaters. We have met all the requirements of the Parks Dept. - except one - the volume. No matter how much we monitor our DJs, the sound level subtly creeps up until an official visits and says our music is projecting to Mineral Springs or the Sheep Meadow or the 79th St. yards.

We constantly strive to make "our thing" more spacious, friendlier and less contentious and have gradually improved our operation. How many events can boast of our kind of longevity with so few incidents of hostility? The decibel issue is always there waiting to shoot us down. We hear it at every meeting we have with the people in charge. Well, we figured we must create a system that puts the control in our hands and let the DJs supply their turntables, records and CDs, and just plug into our system. We put this in a DJ agreement that all who play for us signed in 2000.

Every morning and evening that the Circle set up - until mid May - Tariq was there to make it happen; he never let us down. Thanks to Calvin Coleman, who lent his quiet strength and willing good nature to our endeavors again and again.

Thanks to Tyrone Cloud, who was there for us in the clutches, when we really needed the help; like the day last January when we wrestled the steel equipment storage box through the snow because the Parks Department wouldn't allow us to leave it in Mineral Springs for the winter.

Thanks to Rudy Meadows, who has - for years, now - faithfully helped us start up each session and who keeps an eagle eye on the well-being of the Circle.

Thanks also must go to Alonzo Jones, Bill Levy, Marci Roth, Stu Pollack, Lisa Reich-Scholtisek, Kenny Milne, Ed Carvello, Chris Fazio. Jeff Perry and all the rest of you who keep the Circle turning.

A heartfelt debt of gratitude is owed, by all of us, to those few skaters who have been so generous - even heroic - in writing the sizable checks that helped us replenish our emergency diminished funds; they saved us from financial ruin this season. The Circle could very possibly have ground to a halt at the end of this month if not for their philanthropy.

Finally, no acknowledgment would be complete without mentioning our Founder and Chairman, Lezly Ziering, who has been a tireless advocate for dance skating and a tower of strength, to me personally, and to all of us.


